

VISIT THE CHURCHS



San Nicola di Bari Cathedral (Mother Church)

City's Mother Church, construction works were started in the seventeenth century. Preserves among its treasures the cross, painted by Ruzzolone in 1484 and the seventeenth-century altar dedicated to the Immaculate. *Piazza Duomo.*




Santa Caterina d'Alessandria Church

Built in the fifteenth century, contains frescoes by the Graffeo brothers, portraying scenes from the life of St. Catherine with captions in ancient Sicilian. *Piazza Santa Caterina.*

Madonna della Consolazione Sanctuary

Built in 1553 as a consequence of a miraculous healing as a shrine for pilgrims, contains fine eighteenth-century stucco by the Serpotta's students. *Piazza Liborio Arrigo.*






San Giacomo Church

Built on the ruins of Roman structures in the historic district Rocchecelle. One time Mother Church and probably seat of the ancient Bishopric of Termini Imerese, abolished with the arrival of the Normans. During the centuries it underwent changes that radical marked it. *Via S. Orsola*

Maria SS. Annunziata Church

Dates back to 1453 and rebuilt in the seventeenth century. Is the symbol of the city, due to its location in one of the most historic neighborhoods and its pale blue tiled dome. *Via Annunziata*.




Sant'Orsola Church

Built at the end of the fifteenth century, in the historic district of Rocchecelle, on the existing tower of Saccàri, the church houses the Catacombs of the Society of the Blacks (XVIII c.). *Via Sant'Orsola*.
